The **Latin American Carbon Forum** is a joint effort of the CDM capacity development programmes, **OLADE - University of Calgary - CIDA** and **UNEP/RISØ Centre - Fundación Bariloche "CD4CDM"**, together with the Inter-American Development Bank (**IADB**) and the International Emissions Trading Association (**IETA**). The Forum is hosted by the Ecuadorian Ministry of Environment.

The **Latin American Carbon Forum** aims to revisit the role of capacity building on the CDM and the progress to date on market development. The forum will serve as a regional platform to develop a coherent course of action at the technical, commercial and political levels.

Participants will have the opportunity (i) to look at the lessons learnt on CDM capacity building, (ii) to discuss the importance of networking as a critical success factor for CDM, (iii) to share experiences made by CDM projects in the region, (iv) to get an update on programmes and initiatives coming from the demand and supply sides of the carbon market, and (v) to hold bilateral meetings with project owners, carbon buyers and project design experts.

The Presentations will be held in Spanish and English and simultaneous translation will be provided all days.

The **Latin American Carbon Forum** will take place on March 22nd-24th, 2006 at the Swissôtel in Quito, Ecuador.
